LANGUAGES


In the week beginning 20th September, we celebrated the European Day of Languages which takes place every year. To celebrate linguist diversity, students learnt about animal sounds in different languages during their act of worship. The aim was to understand that there are many different perspectives across countries, cultures and languages across the world and that it is important to understand that our way is not the only possible way of looking at and understanding the world.

This year the languages department also ran a 'Guess the language competition' where tutor groups were shown the names of 30 languages in the actual language. Congratulations to 10CR4 who got an amazing score of 28/30 correct. In second place with 25 correct answers came the Welbeck students from 11TW2 and third place went to 9CR3 with 25 correct answers. Well done! You really seem to know your languages.

YEAR 13 GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK

On Friday 25th September, the Geography Department supported Year 13 on their NEA independent fieldwork projects. Students have devised their own unique lines of enquiry, created their own forms of data collection and identified specific field sites, all based on an area of the course that they had a personal passion for. Topics ranged from carbon source studies in Sherwood Pines, evaluating representations of places and exploring reasons for social inequalities in contrasting locations. 
Hoping to make the summer last a little longer with Tennis in PE.
