Minster Trust for education

The Minster Junior School located in Southwell, is one of Nottinghamshire's best kept secrets. The Junior School offers a musically-focused education within an outstanding state school for up to forty students in Years 3 to 6. Students are admitted to the school through an audition process based upon their musical aptitude and follow a music rich curriculum.

Once admitted, students have choral and orchestral sessions each week and time is given to aural training and music theory. Instrumental and vocal training is



offered to enrich and extend the students musical experience. The school has close links with Southwell Minster Cathedral to support the education of the boy and girl choristers.

Each year students excel in their Key Stage 2 exams through the specialist teaching they receive. A normal school day consists of learning in the core areas of English and Maths in the morning followed by other curriculum areas in the afternoon; music takes the lead on two of these afternoons.
