DR TIMOTHY RENNIE MBE AWARD IN QUEENS BIRTHDAY HONOURS 2021

Dr Timothy RENNIE, a former student of The Minster School, lately Dean of Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Namibia, Windhoek, Namibia has been honoured with an MBE in the 2021 Queens birthday awards for services to the community and education in Namibia.

Tim Rennie attended the Southwell Minster School from 1988 - 1996, firstly as a chorister and then in secondary school and sixth-form. Born in Pakistan his home became Burton Joyce. After sixth-form, Tim returned to Pakistan to studying towards pharmacy

at the University of London. After teaching chemistry and maths at a Edwardes College School, Peshawar, before qualifying as a pharmacist Tim went on to study for a PhD investigating tuberculosis (TB) and continued as a lecturer in the School of Pharmacy and, latterly, commissioning TB services in northeast London.

In 2010 Tim relocated to Namibia to join a team to help set up Namibia's first pharmacy and medical Schools at the University of Namibia. Previously under the apartheid regime of South Africa, Namibia won independence in 1990. Once he established the Bachelor's degree in Pharmacy, Tim and his team went on to develop a Pharmacy Technicians diploma, a training for newly graduated pharmacy students, and a Clinical Pharmacy Master's degree. He also supervised a number of PhD students – the first ever in pharmacy – through to successful completion. Through the development of training, he led the first Department and later School of Pharmacy. By the end of his 10 years in Namibia, Tim was appointed Associate Professor and Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences that included the Schools of Pharmacy, Medicine, Nursing, Public Health and Dentistry.

It was a great surprise and pleasure to hear that Tim had been awarded the MBE in the Queen's birthday Honours. In the Minster School he had joined a group of friends who valued learning, and competed to succeed; they pulled each other along. It was this early learning experience that put him in the right direction towards his academic successes.

What a wonderful journey to success Tim has had, and an impressive example to our students. We are very proud of his achievements and wish him continued success.

ZOE HURDLES HER WAY TO A PERSONAL BEST






