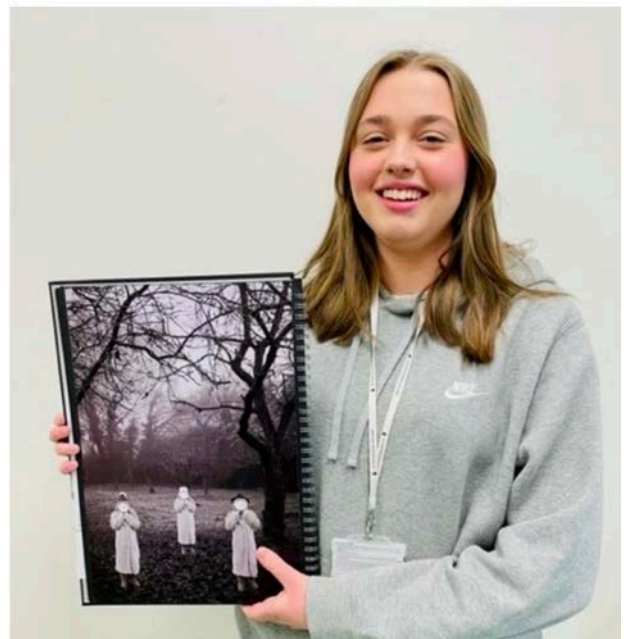

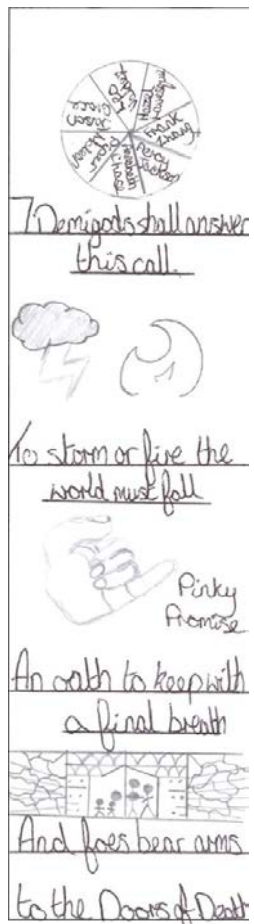
## Clock Watching on display at Tate Modern

# WHAT'S ON IN HISTORY?

The History department is very proud of the work that our students have produced this academic year and we are delighted to share with you some of the current topics being covered in our classes along with some examples of innovative and outstanding student work. Look out for more articles across the rest of the Summer Term.

Year 7 have recently been covering the Tudors in their History classes and tackling some really difficult questions about Henry VIII and the break from Rome. All lessons are linked to the enquiry question 'Did the Tudors break the Church?'

Year 8 are currently finishing their topic on Britain during the 1800's and answering the enquiry 'Did life improve before 1914?'. They've been investigating the Peterloo Massacre, the creation of the Peelers and trying to decipher why the police were unable to catch Jack the Ripper!

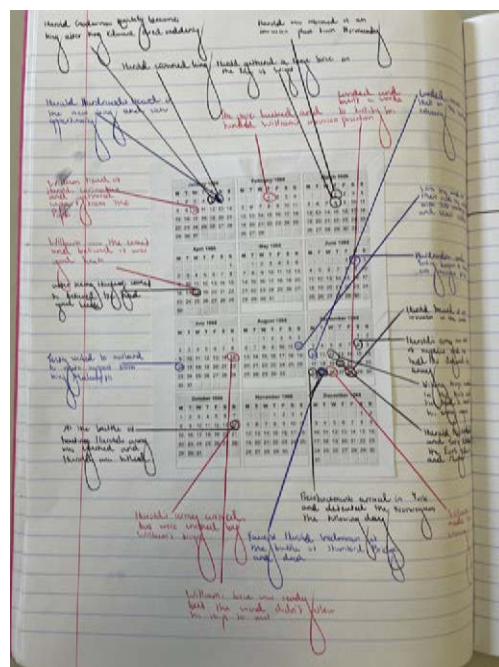
Year 9 have impressed us greatly with their work on their current topic 'Civil Rights: did challenge lead to change?' covering events such as the Montgomery Bus Boycott along with tackling landmark Supreme Court cases such as Plessy vs Ferguson and Brown vs the Board of Education. The maturity that year 9 have shown this year has been fantastic.

Year 10 are already onto Paper 2 of their GCSE curriculum and have been studying the Anglo-Saxons and Normans, understanding how and why William was able to conquer England and beginning to study how he was able to consolidate his power post 1066. Drew in Mr Barnes class produced this fantastic overview of the year of 1066 and the fight for the Crown.

Year 11 are diligently revising and we've seen great attendances in our weekly Wednesday after school revision sessions. Their two years of hard work will soon pay off and we can't wait to see them show off all their ability in their upcoming exams.

Year 12 have been working hard on their A Level topics and will soon begin working on the Non-Examined Assessment which is a 4,500 word essay that assesses a wide range of skills. They've also been working hard on both the Tudor and Russia course, having fun along the way creating rebellion board games, as seen in this image of 'Tudor Risk' created by some of our fantastic students.

Finally Year 13 have been revising hard for their upcoming A-Level exams and we could not be prouder of the work they have put in. Weekly revision sessions have been well attended and students are making every minute count!

We feel that this is an exciting opportunity for our pupils to be in at the beginning of a potentially very beneficial and rewarding national S.T.E.A.M. project.

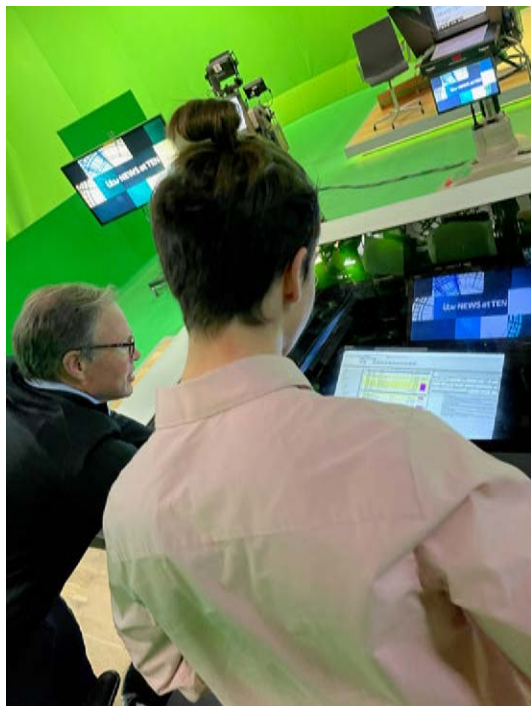
