# **SAFEGUARDING UPDATE**

At the start of this academic year, we launched the **CALL IT OUT** campaign. The main aim of this campaign is to empower students to challenge others and not tolerate discrimination of any type or relational conflict.

Alongside challenging each other some students have also chosen to use the reporting mechanism. Where they aren't comfortable challenging others, this has enabled us to have conversations around use of language and behaviours.

The campaign was launched in assemblies and tutor time activities enabled our students the opportunities to talk through issues, as well as feedback through their tutor reps on how they would like to see the campaign further developed.





### **Child Safety Online:** A practical guide for parents and carers whose children are using social media

Social networking is hugely popular. Many young people are sophisticated in the way they use social media apps and websites, tailoring their communication for different audiences, and accessing them from a range of devices including smartphones, tablets, and games consoles.

But social media, like all forms of public communication, comes with some risks. Not all of these risks turn into actual problems; and if children never face any risks, they never learn how to deal with them. By helping your child understand what the risks are, you can play a big part in preventing them from turning into problems.



#### Understand the risks children may need to deal with

#### What they could see or do:

- Seeing or sharing of violent, sexual and pornographic content
- Inaccurate or false information
- and extreme views Promotion of harmful behaviours including self-harm, anorexia and suicide Over-sharing of personal information Actively or unintentionally getting
- involved in bullying or hurtful behaviour

#### How this could affect them

#### Who they might meet:

- People who might bully, intimidate or frighten
- People posing behind fake
- Fear of missing out leading to excessive use or exaggeration
- Engaging, or being pressured into engaging in more risky behaviour either by
- Developing unrealistic, and perhaps depressing ideals of body image and gender
- Becoming subject to peer pressure or interactions that are intense or too difficult to handle
- Creating an online reputation that may create problems for them in the future

### 6TH FORM POLITICS STUDENTS ENJOY STUDENTS ENJOY PARLIAMENT TOUR 6th October 2022

Year 12 and 13 Politics students visited London last week for a tour of the UK Supreme Court and Houses of Parliament. 33 students travelled down to the capital, arriving in Parliament Square and visiting the UK Supreme Court, where they were guided around the courtrooms by Mr Wall. Students were able to learn about the role of the Supreme Court in the judicial process and how it has helped to make judgements on issues such as the prorogation of parliament and human rights. The students also had the opportunity to see a live case in the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, witnessing some arguments in a case from the Bahamas. After lunch, the group made their way around the Houses of Parliament on a guided tour, visiting the House of Lords through the Sovereign's entrance, followed by the House of Commons and voting lobbies. Students were able to ask questions about the workings of parliament and learn about the role of citizens in scrutiny and protest. We also had a workshop which focused on the successes and failures of pressure groups and think tanks in our democracy.

Last week all of our Y13 students experienced a practice interview to prepare them for their future endeavours. Students were carefully matched with a professional who specialised in their chosen field and experienced a formal interview situation.
